Not Folk Dance	Folk Dance
 Performed by members of a group as part of their cultural expression. Cultural insiders <u>do not</u> consider the movement dance. Cultural insiders understand what the movements mean. Cultural outsiders may or may not understand the meaning of the movements. Has certain required movements, but allows for innovation. Has rhythmic movements learned from others in the group by watching and imitating. May or may not be performed to music. 	 Performed by members of a group as part of their cultural expression. Cultural insiders <u>do</u> consider the movement dance. Cultural insiders understand what the movements mean. Cultural outsiders may or may not understand the meaning of the movements. Has certain required movements, <u>but may or may not</u> allow for innovation. Has rhythmic movements learned from others in the group by watching and imitating. Performed to music from that cultural group.
Examples Stylized walk in jazz funerals (to a dirge on the way to the church) Easter Rock movements in church Swaying and clapping of gospel choirs Sports fans' movements, often in response to school band or cheerleaders 	Examples Cajun Two-Step Polka Second line dancing Square dancing Waltz Native American Snake Dance
