CLIFTON CHENIER



BORN: June 25, 1925 DIED: December 12, 1987 BIRTHPLACE: Opelousas

STYLE: Zydeco

INSTRUMENT: Chromatic accordion

DATES OF CAREER: 1950s-1980s

Blues/Louisiana Stomp, 1954, Elko Records Ay-Tete-Fille, 1955, Specialty Records Louisiana Blues & Zydeco, 1964, Arhoolie I'm Here!, 1982, Alligator Records


AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS:

Grammy, 1983, for album *I'm Here!* White House performance, 1984 International performances throughout career

MUSICAL CONTRIBUTIONS:

Electrified old-time *la-la*, added *rhythm & blues*, and created a new style called "zydeco" which became locally, nationally, and internationally celebrated.

BORN: August 8, 1921 DIED: February 24, 1991 BIRTHPLACE: West Monroe

STYLE: Country

INSTRUMENT: Guitar

DATES OF CAREER: 1930s-1980s

IMPORTANT RECORDINGS:

Wondering, 1951, Decca Records That Heart Belongs to Me, 1952, Decca There Stands the Glass, 1953, Decca More and More, 1954, Decca Slowly, 1954, Decca (first recording ever to feature a pedal-steel guitar) In the Jailhouse Now, 1955, Decca Honky Tonk Song, 1957, Decca Tupelo County Jail, 1958, Decca Caught in the Webb, 2001, Audium (tribute album after his death)

AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS:

Louisiana Hayride, 1950-1952 Country Music Hall of Fame, 2001 Number One Singles: 13 Top Ten Songs: 54

MUSICAL CONTRIBUTIONS:

Became nationally recognized in the commercial country world.
